The Australian Health Survey was announced by the Federal Government last month to start in 2011. This presentation will describe how the largest Australian population health survey is being designed - including nutrition, physical activity and biomedical measures combined with the usual health and risk factor data from the former National Health Survey and Indigenous Health Survey. The presentation will also create an opportunity for discussion about output strategy and data access issues.

Dr Paul Jelfs is the Assistant Statistician in charge of the Health Information Branch. Paul manages a Branch that is delivering the Australian Health Survey and also has a role in the Survey of Disability Ageing and Carers, Patient Experience Survey, Survey of Mental Health and Wellbeing and the use of administrative data for Apparent Consumption of Alcohol.

This is an exceptional opportunity to hear firsthand about this important project from Dr Paul Jelfs, who will lead the survey.
